Tribal Victim Assistance

Crime victims can experience trauma and long-term impacts on their daily lives. The Tribal Victim Services/Set-Aside Program offers a wide range of services designed to support victims and to help them overcome challenges in the aftermath of the crime.

SERVICES PROVIDED

- Support Group Meetings
- Tuition assistance (including fees and books) for short-term training
- · Utility assistance for transitional (temporary) needs
- Community outreach
- Victim advocacy
- Goal planning (educational/training)
- · Informational materials on victims' rights and services
- Coordination efforts with other Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma service providers and stakeholders
- Other emergency services as needed that will restore the victims' sense of dignity and self-esteem

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- Crime victims who hold a Certificate of Degree of Indian Blood (CDIB) from a federally recognized tribe and live within the Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma's service area eligible for assistance.
 - Elder Abuse
 - Homicide
 - Gang Violence
 - DWI Victims of Crime
 - Other Crimes
